**Fox Point-Bayside School District Academic Assessments**

Students at Fox Point Bayside School District participate in a variety of assessments, some standardized, some informal to help guide teaching and learning.

Assessment	Description	Participating Students	Required by Department of Public Instruction
Early Literacy Screener  (AimsWeb beginning in 2024)	Districts in the state of Wisconsin are required to administer an early literacy screening assessment for all students enrolled in 4K-2nd grade to determine reading readiness and risk of having reading difficulty. This is an assessment of literacy fundamentals.	Students in grades 4K-2	
Wisconsin Forward Exam	The Forward Exam is the Wisconsin state exam and measures how well students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. The Standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be college and career ready. The Forward Exam is administered online in the spring of each school year.	Students in grades 3-8 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics  Students in grades 4 and 8 in Science and Social Studies	
ACCESS Testing	The ACCESS is for students who have been identified as English learners (ELs) and is used to monitor students' progress in acquiring academic English. The assessment measures students' reading, listening, writing and speaking abilities in English. The results serve to aid in determining when ELs have attained the language proficiency needed to participate meaningfully in content area classrooms without program support and on state academic content tests without accommodations. Dynamic Learning Map (DLM)	DLM is an assessment that measures the academic progress of students with significant cognitive disabilities in ELA, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies. A student's IEP team must determine eligibility for a student to participate in this alternative assessment.	Qualifying students in grades 3-8	

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP)	The MAP assessment is used as a universal screening tool in both Math and ELA and is administered in fall, winter and spring. This tool provides national norms of student achievement and growth in math and ELA.	Math grades 1-8 Reading grades 2-8	
FastBridge Progress Monitoring	The FastBridge Progress Monitoring tools are used to provide frequent progress checks on students receiving interventions. These probes help evaluate the effectiveness of a given intervention on a student's progress in a select skill or set of skills.	Select students in grades K-8 based on need
