FACILITIES PROJECT COMMUNITY UPDATE

We are thrilled about the advancements in our voter-approved facilities projects! Set to open for the 2024-25 school year, Bayside Middle School is nearing completion with interior painting, flooring and lighting fixtures, and the final piece of the building envelope being installed. At Stormonth Elementary, new district office and locker room spaces are taking shape. We've made great headway and anticipate celebrating the completion of these projects this fall! Ensuring the safety of every student, staff member and community member remains our top priority. Please observe the posted signs to maintain a secure environment during this construction period.

STORMONTH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:

Stormonth Elementary School is undergoing further enhancements with a comprehensive system overhaul, including replacing the original HVAC and electrical systems after 230 windows were replaced last summer. New interior finishes, exterior doors and a fire suppression sprinkler system are also being installed. Construction crews have mobilized, so expect to see trailers, equipment, fencing, signage and workers in high-visibility attire in and around the site.

1. ENGAGING ACADEMIC CURIOSITY:

GOALS: The goals in Pillar 1 collectively focus on enhancing the quality of education provided to students.

PROGRESS:

- Introduced effective teaching methods across classrooms, ensuring that instruction meets the diverse needs of our students.
- Integrated artistic opportunities into our curriculum through programs like "Art and Beyond" and curricular extensions promoting creative thinking across all subject areas.
- Developed a comprehensive district-wide math vision informed by proven success metrics that provides a cohesive framework for teaching math and improving student achievement in the subject.
- Integrated computer science into our curriculum by offering elective courses at Bayside and making progress at Stormonth, aligning with ITL standards.
- Improved communication and collaborative planning efforts among educators to enhance instructional practices and promote student success.
- Provided professional development opportunities to educators to further enhance teaching skills, particularly in math and computer science, ensuring that educators are equipped to deliver high-quality instruction.

GOALS: Pillar 2 goals address fostering effective communication with legislators, ensuring financial stability and optimizing facility maintenance and management practices to support a thriving learning community.

PROGRESS:

Significant efforts have been made to enhance financial stability, ensuring a sustainable future for our school district.

- Coinciding with Goal 2, Superintendent Dellutri participated in the State Legislative Study Committee on K12 Shared Services, underscoring our commitment to proactive engagement with policymakers.
- Featured multiple "State of the District" articles in community newsletters to keep our community informed and engaged in the district's fiscal health.
- Used interest income to maximize renovation opportunities at Stormonth.
- Collaborated with the University of Wisconsin Applied Population Laboratory to obtain valuable enrollment projections to plan effectively for the future.

GOALS: The prioritization of the holistic well-being of students and staff within the school district are the main focus of Pillar 3 goals.

PROGRESS:

- Introduced a monthly counseling newsletter designed to inform families about available resources, like
 Clinical Psychology Associates (CPA) and the Student and Family Assistance Program (SFAP).
- Aligned with our goal of developing an Equitable Multi-Level System of Supports (EMLSS) to address the socialemotional needs of students, we carefully selected and implemented RULER as our new SEL program.
- Partnered with the Mental Health and Wellness (MHW) committee and CESA 6 to ensure our strategies are informed by expert guidance and tailored to the specific needs of our district.

- Connected students with a variety of professional and cultural environments through field trips to local institutions like the John Michael Kohler Arts Center and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.
- Hosted several authors at our school, fostering a love for reading and enhancing students' understanding of narrative techniques and storytelling.
- Expanded the Artist in Residence program that brought professional artists into our school to offer students mentorship and insight into artistic processes, sparking creativity and innovation in student projects.

- Affirmed by our board, we revised library policies to ensure they align with the principles of justice and equity.
- Established a partner district equity team, with representatives from each district, to collaboratively spearhead equity initiatives and ensure consistent implementation.

 provide meaningful learning experiences that promote

With RULER, we are taking significant strides toward achieving this holistic vision of education.

RULER is an acronym for **Recognizing**, **Understanding**, **Labeling**, **Expressing** and **Regulating** emotions.

It provides a comprehensive framework that empowers students, educators and families to develop essential emotional intelligence skills crucial for success in school and beyond. By integrating RULER into our curriculum and school culture, we aim to create a supportive environment where emotions are acknowledged, understood and effectively managed.

Research has shown that social and emotional learning not only enhances academic performance but also
