WHAT'S NEXT?


Families, staff and community members will continue to play an essential role in the process through opportunities to meet the finalists. Details about these engagements will be shared in the coming months.

STATE OF THE **DISTRICT**



SCHOOL BUDGETING IN WISCONSIN

Every two years, the State of Wisconsin sets its budget, impacting school funding. Despite a \$4.6 billion General Fund surplus, the state's share of K-12 funding has dropped from 43.1% in 2003 to 36.6% in 2023. As state funding has failed to keep pace with inflation, school districts across Wisconsin have increasingly turned to operational referendums to bridge the gap. In fact, 2024 saw a record number of school district operational referendums across the state.

► THE ROLE OF OPERATIONAL REFERENDUMS

Fox Point-Bayside has passed four-year operational referendums in 2014, 2018 and 2022 to sustain daily operations like teacher and staff salaries, staffing levels and small class sizes, and maintain current programs and services. The current referendum is funding operations through June 2027. The amount of the next replacement operational referendum will be largely determined by the K12 funding approved by the State Legislature and Governor in the 2025-27 Biennial Budget. We hope that the 2025-27 Biennial Budget will include sufficient, sustainable funding for schools across the state.

ADVOCACY FOR SUSTAINABLE FUNDING

To address the state budget challenges, the district actively works with the Wisconsin School Administrators Alliance to advocate for sustainable, predictable and flexible state funding. Key priorities include:

1

INCREASED SPECIAL EDUCATION AID

Raising reimbursement levels to 60% would ease financial pressure and reduce reliance on general education funds. 2

INFLATION-ADJUSTED REVENUE LIMITS

Providing school districts with revenue increases tied to inflation would help maintain financial stability.

3

BALANCED STATE AID

A combination of revenue limit increases, general aid and per-pupil funding would provide more equitable resources for districts of all sizes. 4

RAISING THE MINIMUM REVENUE LIMIT

Increasing the statewide minimum revenue limit would help reduce disparities between districts and lessen the need for operational referendums.

These recommendations are strategically aimed to provide school districts with the resources they need to meet the diverse needs of their students, with a particular focus on special education funding, flexible revenue streams and addressing disparities between low-revenue districts.



PROJECTED ENROLLMENT GROWTH

As our district looks to the future, **one of the key factors influencing our financial planning is enrollment growth.** A recent study by UW-Madison's Applied Population Lab projects significant enrollment growth in Fox Point-Bayside over the next five years. Key findings include:

- Birth rates in the district have been rising since the mid-2000s and are expected to continue increasing.
- The number of households with school-age children has grown, with more young families moving into the area.
- Kindergarten enrollment has steadily increased over the last decade and is projected to continue its upward trend.
- Overall, K4-eighth grade enrollment is expected to grow between 12-18.5%, with the strongest gains in fifth through eighth grade.



Enrollment growth is significant because **state funding for schools is partly based on student population**. As Fox Point-Bayside's enrollment increases, it may qualify for additional state aid. However, if the state does not adequately adjust funding levels to account for this growth, the district will still need to rely more on local funding sources, including operational referendums.

► NON-RESIDENT ENROLLMENT CHANGES

As resident enrollment increases, we face shifts in our enrollment policies. The district has phased out the Chapter 220 voluntary integration program, which ended through state legislation in 2015-16, with the 2024-25 school year. The program allowed students to complete their education in their non-resident school district.

Additionally, as the number of resident students continues to grow, the district has had to limit open enrollment seats in recent years. With projected increases in resident enrollment, Fox Point-Bayside will not offer any new open enrollment seats for the 2025-26 school year.

BUDGET PROJECTIONS

The district is actively planning for the future as we navigate the impact of enrollment growth and the need for sustainable state funding. As outlined in Pillar 2 of our strategic plan "Framework for Our Future," we are committed to being good stewards of the district's financial resources. As such, we are focused on ensuring financial stability and preparing for various scenarios, including the potential need for additional resources. Our goal is to continue to provide high-quality education while balancing the district's financial health.

This hands-on experience brought their learning to life, making it memorable and meaningful. Furthermore, our partnership with the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra's (MSO) Arts in Community Education (ACE) program brings world-renowned musicians into our classrooms. Students are captivated by live performances, sparking their interest in music and the arts. Author visits ignite imaginations and inspire a passion for reading and writing, showing students that they too can become storytellers.

These enriching experiences demonstrate our commitment to providing a well-rounded education that goes beyond academics. By connecting learning to real-world experiences, we empower our students to become curious, engaged and lifelong learners.



First graders learned about the wide range of instruments in the percussion family through a classroom visit from the MSO Percussion Duo. Instruments and compositions from around the world help support Stormonth's efforts to highlight artists and creators from different cultures and traditions around the world.



There is nothing cozier than settling in with a good book! "Hibernation Day" challenged third graders to create the perfect habitat for a relaxing day of reading. Stormonth teachers are constantly finding connections between classroom subjects and activities to bring learning to life.



Kindergarten students learned about the string family of instruments, along with what it means to be an outstanding audience member. Through the ACE program, sponsored by the Educational Foundation, Stormonth students learn alongside members of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra and other professional artists in the Milwaukee community.

The winter season brought exciting opportunities for Bayside students, including participation in various groups and clubs such as girls and boys basketball and ski & snowboard club. We are especially proud of our Bayside performing arts groups. Our band, choir and orchestra recently presented their winter music concerts, showcasing some incredible student talent! It was exciting to entertain our audiences for the first time in our brand new venue, enjoying the use of our new stage and gymnasium! Some highlights from these wonderful programs are featured below:



Over 125 students across four grade levels are participating in our Bayside bands this year! Seventh and eighth grade band students also have the opportunity to perform in two jazz band groups. For the second year in a row, jazz band students attended the Chicagoland Jazz Workshop on January 25. This daylong workshop brings together area high schools and middle schools, renowned artists and inspiring clinicians to provide an educational and listening experience for students and music educators. Students started the day off with a cultural activity at Mitsuwa in Arlington Heights and then took part in the competition!





Bayside choir just finished presenting their winter concerts in January. Over 90 students participated in these performances. An added feature this year was the inclusion of student instrumentalists accompanying the choir on selected pieces. This showcased additional student talent and enhanced the enjoyment of our audience.

Bayside orchestra enjoyed a strong start to the year as they presented their winter concerts under the direction of our new orchestra teacher, Ms. Lauren Harvath. Currently there are over 55 students, school-wide, participating in the Bayside orchestra.





The ski & snowboard club continues to be a popular activity, and this year is no different. We had another record number of participants with approximately 160 students attending four total outings to Little Switzerland in January and February. We are grateful to the club advisors, chaperones and parents who help make this club a success.

In January, our seventh grade students took part in a unique winter camping experience at Camp MacLean in Burlington, Wisconsin. Students developed their sense of team and cooperation through various outdoor education programs and activities. Students spent three days enjoying the outdoors while staying mostly technology free!



The seventh and eighth grade girls basketball team had a short six-week season, finishing with two wins and six losses. They consistently demonstrated tremendous effort, support for each other, excellent sportsmanship and inspiring teamwork. They showed

resilience and never gave up, despite some narrow losses and challenging games. The team capped off the season with an exciting student and faculty basketball game. We extend our best wishes to the graduating eighth graders and hope they continue to play basketball at the high school level.

We are pleased to share the fantastic news that the Fox Point-Bayside School District "Significantly Exceeds" Expectations," according to the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). The DPI recently released district and school report cards for the 2023-24 school year, and our district received an outstanding rating of 93.8!

The report cards also include scores for each district and school in four priority areas: Student Achievement, Student Growth, Target Group Outcomes and On-Track to Graduation.

These outstanding ratings highlight the incredible dedication of our students, staff and community, showcasing significant progress toward our strategic goal of fostering students' academic curiosity.

FRAMEWORK FOR OUR FUTURE IN FOCUS: RULER


This school year, we officially launched RULER, an evidence-based approach to social and emotional learning (SEL) developed by the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence. This program was created to support the social-emotional needs of our students, reflecting our commitment to prioritizing their holistic well-being, as outlined in Pillar 3 in our strategic plan Framework for Our Future.

Social and emotional learning strengthens academic performance, resilience and relationships. By equipping students with emotional intelligence skills, we help them navigate challenges, communicate effectively and build empathy.

Since its implementation, teachers have shared that their classrooms have a great sense of community due to the shared language RULER embeds into everyday interactions. Teachers have also reported increased participation and leadership from students due to high levels of engagement.

MOOD METER





The Mood Meter helps students identify their current emotional state by considering if they feel up or down, pleasant or unpleasant, energized or depleted. This practice builds emotional vocabulary and supports emotional wellness.

WHAT IS RULER? RULER—short for Recognizing, Understanding, Labeling, Expressing and Regulating emotions—is now fully embedded in classrooms across our district. Students use tools like the "Mood Meter" to identify their feelings and build emotional awareness. In kindergarten and first grade, the Best Self lessons are fostering strong home-school connections. By embedding emotional intelligence practices into daily learning, we're equipping students with skills that extend far beyond the classroom, preparing them for success in relationships, academics and future challenges they may face.





This class of third graders created and signed their class charter, an agreement they created together outlining encouraged classroom behaviors.

IMPLEMENTING RULER AT HOME

Parents and caregivers are essential to this initiative, and we're excited to welcome our parent liaison, Krystal Melbye. Krystal is a certified parent coach, Love and Logic Trainer, and Siblings Without Rivalry Trainer with a background in elementary and special education. She has been collaborating with the district to connect families with resources to reinforce RULER principles at home. To further support this partnership, we're offering workshops that provide practical tools and insights that align with what students are learning.

To explore how RULER can make a difference for your family, join our upcoming workshop at the district office hosted by Krystal Melbye. These one-hour sessions will be held at 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. and are open to all caregivers. Together, we're building a school community where emotional wellness and academic success go hand in hand.
